BSSVD Research Awards

The British Society for the Study of Vulval Diseases has established a small grant scheme aimed to encourage healthcare staff to undertake investigative research. This small grant scheme is particularly aimed to support research that is judged and likely to lead to:

- Publication in peer-reviewed journals
- Tangible improvement in vulval disease diagnosis and treatment

The BSSVD includes promotion of excellence in medical research in its goals and invites members to submit a proposal for a research project. Funding may be provided up to £10,000.

Lisa Kirby, a trainee from Glasgow, has been awarded a £10,000 British Skin Foundation/BAD Dermatology Trainee Research Small Grant Award, with **Rosalind Simpson** and **Caroline Owen** as coapplicants on the proposal. Lisa will be undertaking research to establish whether urinary incontinence is associated with lichen sclerosus in female patients. Methodology used will be a systematic review and a cross-sectional study using a database collected through routine clinic appointments.

Deadline for submission is 31st March annually and the terms and conditions and application form can be found <u>HERE</u>.

Expression of interest to write book on vulvodynia

Are you interested in a possible new publishing project? Cambridge University Press are investigating the idea of a new book on vulvodynia. They believe that there is a growing market for this type of product as the stigma surrounding the topic decreases and patients are more likely to seek advice. The target readership would be non-specialists including primary care practitioners. The book would be pragmatic and practical, with lots of case-histories and clear evidence-based advice on management. At the moment they are sounding out the potential for such a book.
